In 2003, they began raising their first Future LeaderDog. A yellow Labrador Retriever named Lily. Since then, they have raised nine Future Leader Dogs and are currently raising their tenth. The Krajniks currently have two working Leader Dogs-Nika and Poppy.

Raising Puppies is a family affair. Tom brings the puppies to work with him during the week to expose them to the sights, sounds and smells of a car dealership. Myrna brings the puppies with her to church, the grocery store, and many other places that a working guide would go with a client. When their children were still in school, the puppies would attend their children's activities with them.



Myrna works in maintenance at Point Beach Nuclear plant. Tom is co-owner and parts manager of Krajnik Chevrolet. They have three adult children. Sam and his wife Megan Krajnik of Milwaukee, Kenny Krajnik and his fiancé, Rachael Wheeler of Indianapolis, IN and Elizabeth Krajnik of Buffalo, NY.

SRI VASUDEVAN

LION SRI VASUDEVAN

Lion SRI Vasudevan is a member of the Port Washington Lions Club since June of 2017. He was appointed "Chair of Children's Cancer" for MD27 at the council meeting of January 2018 and continues as the chair. SRI is second Vice President in his club.

Lion SRI had submitted a GRANT proposal to Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) from MD 27 Lions, to help "children with cancer". This was approved by LCIF for \$100,000 in May 2018. The MD27 Lions, raised in excess of the matching \$100,000. A "Flow Cytometer" was ordered for the Children's Hospital of Wisconsin/ Medical College of Wisconsin. & a check for this was presented with the MACC fund, the MD27 Lions "twinning partner" in the grant, on November 29th, 2018.

A second grant for another "Flow cytometer" for the Carbone Cancer Center was submitted in January 2019. With the excess money raised and contribution from MACC fund, the second Grant was approved in May 2019. The check will be presented to UW-Madison in fall 2019 for nearly \$200,000. Lion SRI can provide an "update on MD27 Childhood Grants" at meetings.

In June 2019, Lion SRI was appointed as the first "Lion Ambassador for Campaign 100: Empowering service. Lion SRI is working with the LCIF district coordinator's and is presenting an educational presentation on LCIF 100.

Lion SRI is a physician, who retired from active practice after 39 years in the specialty of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation (PM&R) and Pain Medicine. He is currently Clinical Professor of PM&R at the Medical College of Wisconsin.
