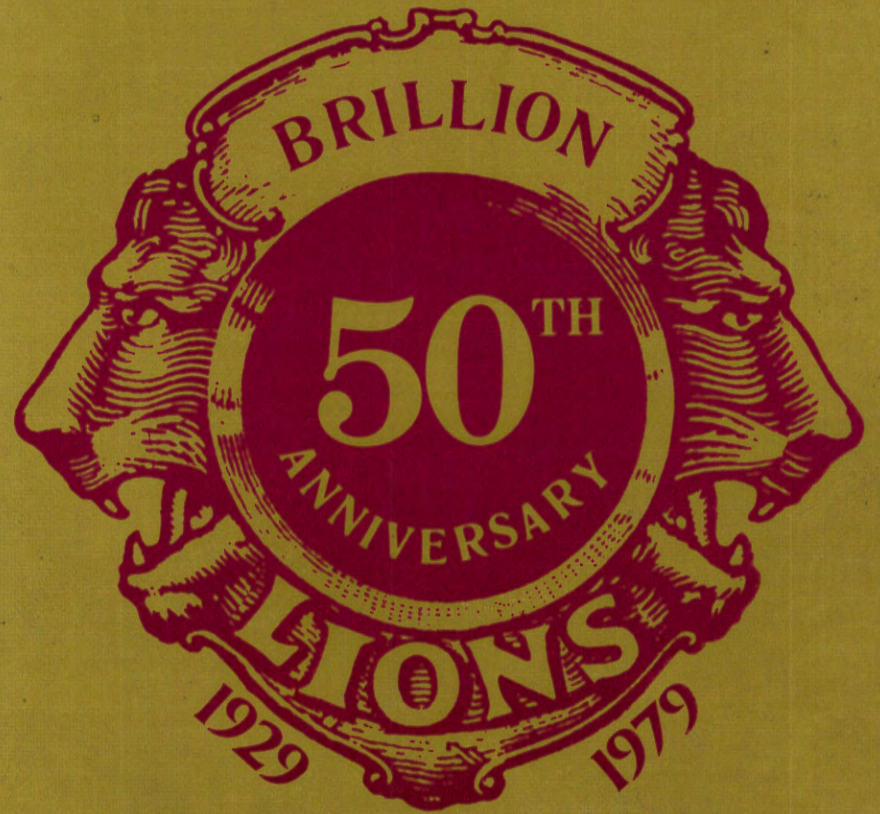
### In Memoriam

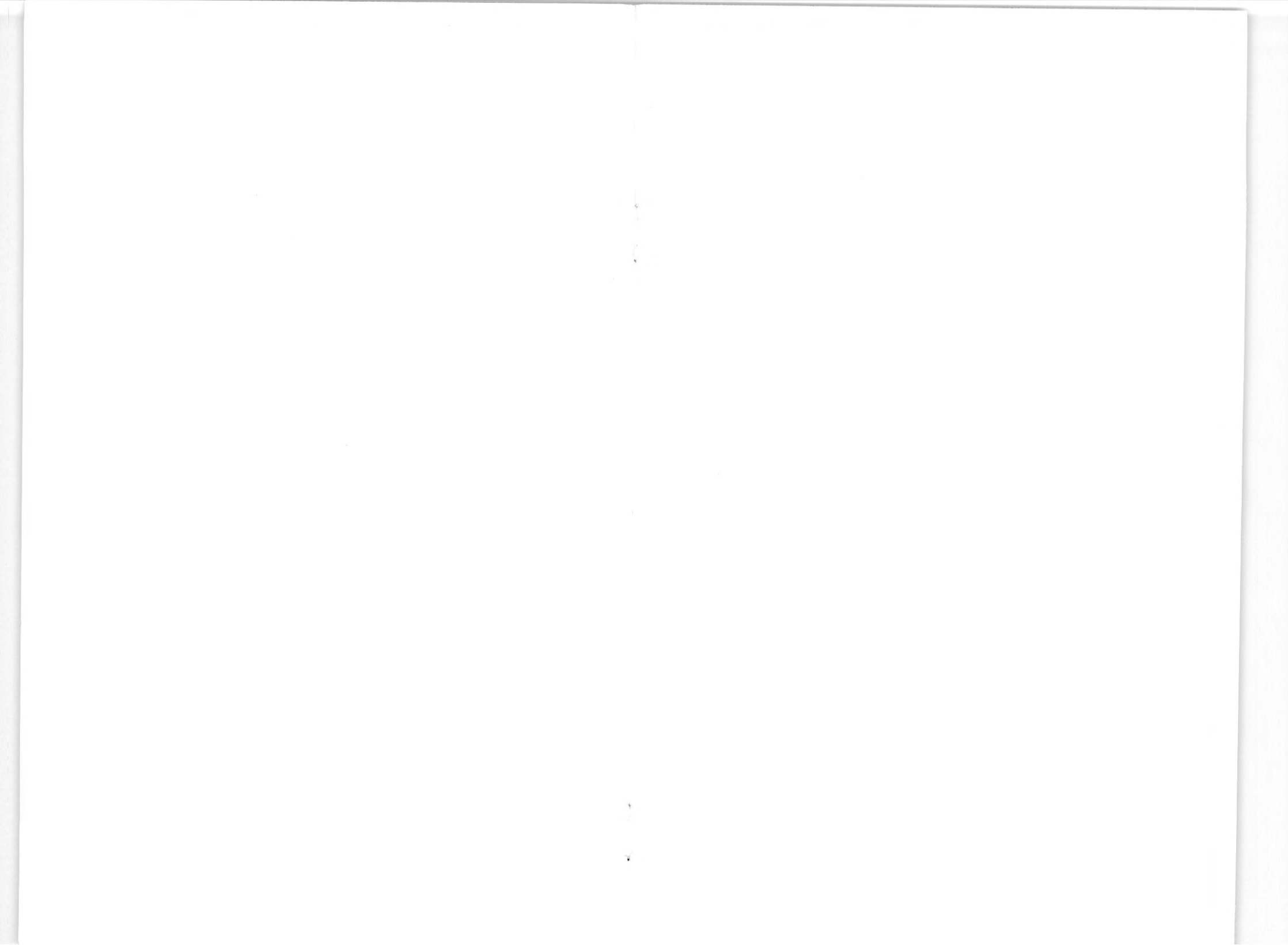

group. In 1944 they led the drive to convert Brillion from a village to a city. In 1947 we helped raise money for new BHS band uniforms and choral robes.

Among the projects in the 50's were the raising of \$15,000 for the lighted high school athletic field, a get-out-the-vote campaign, sponsorship of the Boy Scout Jamboree in Brillion and dedication of a monument in Horn Park to the late Hugo Muehlbach. In 1960 our club, in conjunction with the JC's sponsored the opening of Brillion's newly lighted and widened Main Street. Flower boxes on light standards were another club contribution. An ice skating rink was developed and maintained in the downtown area. The club initiated purchases at the Fat Stock Show and Gilt Sale for the benefit of rural youth. In 1969 the club sponsored its first post-prom party.

Another of the activities brought club members and their wives on a visit to the State Lions Camp at Rosholt to see, first-hand, how the visually handicapped can enjoy nature and the outdoors. Also in 1969 the club took part in the Glaucoma Detection Clinic at Holy Family Hospital, Manitowoc. Lion Howard Heimke was made an honorary director in the club.

In 1970 Brillion Lions sponsored the BHS band at the State Convention in Stevens Point. It was also on April 20, 1970 that we held our last meeting at the Masonic Hall. Local churches provided the dinner-meeting place until the Community Center was ready. A new project, the Youth Swim Meet was instituted in 1971. During the following year our club participated in the Cabin Project at the Lions Camp. Also we donated a Braille typewriter to an area youngster.

Another milestone in our club's history was observed on February 16, 1974 when we celebrated our 45th anniversary at Michiels. It was in 1974 that Brillion Lions sponsored Boy Scout Troop 977. Also this was the year when Michiels was designated as the "official meeting place." During 1975 our club collected 387 pairs of used eye glasses and also donated a landscape seeder to the Wisconsin Lions Camp.

# The First Half

The Brillion Lions Club has often been referred to by Lions International as a "model small town club." Its present membership of nearly 80 is an amalgamation of men from a cross section of the business community. Its high morale and boundless enthusiasm is reflected in the multitude and magnitude of its activities. While many members have known the Brillion Lions Club only as a well organized, well financed and smooth operating service club, the early years were something else. We hope that this brief history will convey the story of how it all began and how our club evolved.

Enthusiasm reigned supreme among the nucleus of would-be Lions who welcomed a delegation from the Manitowoc Club on June 12, 1929 and formally organized the Brillion Lions Club that evening. But this initial bloom soon faded and it was only through the efforts of a few determined members that the club was regenerated to the necessary 20 members to receive official recognition. The Charter Night was held on October 3, 1929 at the Masonic Temple on Main Street, with 145 Lions and their ladies in attendance — including members from Sheboygan Falls and Manitowoc, the host club.

Born only months before the historic crash of '29, our club experienced many a crucial test during its rocky beginning—when during the early 30's of the depression the banks failed and the limited funds of the new club "disappeared." Dinner meetings were discontinued and the meeting place was moved to the high school.

But despite the hardships, two major projects, the Easter Egg Hunt and Halloween Party were inaugurated in 1929 and have been continued for 50 years. Brillion Lions were also instrumental in having Highway 10 paved two years ahead of schedule and led in planning of the new highway's opening celebration.

In 1935 the club conceived and promoted the Golden Jubilee Celebration, commemorating Brillion's incorporation as a municipality. The Club's major activity in 1938 was the concerted effort to secure a public auditorium for BHS. During 1939-40 the club held annual 4-H and FFA Fairs and sponsored a blood donors

## HISTORY OF THE WISCONSIN LIONS PAST INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR EDWARD S. EICK

The forty-sixth annual convention of Lions Clubs International was held in Miami Beach, Florida, June 19-22, 1963, and the Lions of the World honored the Wisconsin Lions by electing Lion Eddie Eick to represent the Wisconsin Lions on the International Board for the next two years.

Eddie, who now lives in Chilton, Wisconsin, joined the Brillion Lions Club February 1, 1931, held many club offices and committees and served as President for the 1953-1954 year. During 1944-1945, he served as Zone Chairman of District 27 B, and in June, 1945 at a District Convention at Appleton, (due to the War Restrictions, no International or State Lions Conventions were held that year), he was elected to serve as District Governor of District 27 B for the 1945-1946 year. During this term, he served as the State Council Secretary and Treasurer, Chartered Mishicot with 34 Charter Members, and Crandon with 86 Charter Members. (This could be a record for Chartered Members for a Club.) District 27 B ended up with a net gain of 292 members for his year. In 1963 P.D.G. Eddie was elected to become the fifth Wisconsin Lion to serve on the International Board as an International Director, and served during the years 1963-1965.

During his many years as a Lion, he served on the State level as a member of the State Lions Bowling Committee from June 1955 to June 1965, as Chairman of this Committee for the years 1959-1960, 1964-1965, member of the State Resolution Committee for 10 years. He was secretary 1959-1960 — Vice President 1960-1961 — President 1961-1962 of the Past District Governors Organization and worked four months in 1966 when District 27 B was divided. On the International Level, he served as Chairman of the State Parade and Delegates Committee to the 1956 International Convention at New York City when Clarence L. Sturm was elected to the high office of Third Vice President. He also served on the Elections Committee at the International Conventions during the years 1966, 1967, 1968 and 1970 and as Chairman of the Credentials Committee in 1960. P.I.D. Eddie has received many awards and citations which includes the 100% District Governors Award, Melvin Jones Birthday Program Award, Key Member Award, Extension Award, four International Presidents Awards and Melvin Jones Fellow. He has maintained a perfect attendance record since becoming a member and is now an Honorary Life Director of the Brillion Lions Club. He received a Certificate of Award dated August 23, 1944 which was signed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Administrator Chester Bowles, OPA Certificate of Appreciation dated July 1, 1959 signed by President Dwight D. Eisenhower, and co-signed by Governor Gaylord Nelson for serving for ten years as an uncompensated member of the Selective Service System, the same certificate dated May 31, 1964 for fifteen years signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson and co-signed by Governor John W. Reynolds, and later the same certificate dated May 31, 1969 for 20 years signed by President Richard M. Nixon and co-signed by Governor Warren P. Knowles. As a Civic Leader in his community, he has served as District Attorney of Calumet County during the years 1931-1939, Secretary of the Calumet County Bar Association for the years 1937-1961, President of the Calumet County Bar Association during the years 1961-1964, President of the Fraternal Order of Eagles Aerie 1228 during 1941-1942, and Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus 2556 during 1941-1942, Chairman Calumet County Chapter of Infantile Paralysis for years 1939-1954, was City Attorney for city of Chilton during 1947-1969. Lion Eddie was born in Brillion, Wisconsin October 13, 1905, and has been a practicing attorney since August 4, 1930, after he graduated from the Marquette University Law School. He is an Elk, Knight of Columbus and a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles.

Edward S. Eick of Chilton was elected a Director of Lions International at the 1963 International Convention in Miami Beach, Florida. A member of the Brillion Lions Club since 1931, he has served his club as President and many other club offices and has a perfect attendance record of 58 years. He has been Zone Chairman and a 100% District Governor during 1945-46 and has served on the District Cabinet for 30 years.

He is a Key Member, holds an Extension Award, four International President's Awards and is a Melvin Jones Fellow. He has served on various State and International Committees including Chairman of the Credentials Committee at the 1960 International Convention in Chicago.

He is an Elk, Knight of Columbus and a member of the Fraternal Order of the Eagles.
