

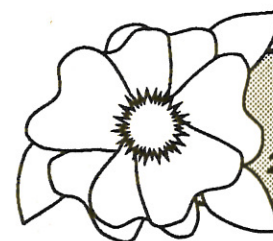

He is a past president of the Forest Lake Lions Club and served as district governor and in numerous capacities on the district level, including chairmanships of Drug Awareness, Convention, Membership and Constitution and Bylaws committees. He was also chairman of the Activities and Constitution and Bylaws committees for his multiple district.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past Director Tyler has received the 100% District Governor Award, two Extension Awards, two International President's Certificates of Appreciation and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor granted by the association to its members. He is also a Melvin Jones Fellow.

He is active in his community and is treasurer of his local chapter of the American Heart Association. Past Director Tyler and his wife, Joyce, have four children.



• ROSENDALE LIONS • A LITTLE HISTORY •

The Rosendale Lions was a working club from its beginning. At the start many of the activities revolved around getting the little league in order. However, soon after charter night, requests came in to help in community illnesses, disasters, and just about everything else. Therefore, funds went to Scouts, Santa Visits, Easter Egg Hunts, Drug Abuse Programs, Scholarships, Badger Girls and Boys, Camps, High School Band and Chorus, Fire Department, Diabetes, Wisconsin Lions Foundation, Baseball, Student Trips, Senior Dinners, Halloween Programs, Nature Trail, Visions Youth Center, Post proms, Taylor Park Program, United Way and Cerebral Palsy, Lions Care and Lions Clubs International Foundation, Leader Dog for the Blind, Lions Youth Exchange, Jaws of Life, Rosendale Area First Responders, Hearing Dog, Fight For Sight, the Brad Westenberg Fundraiser, Community Signs, and many other activities.

From its inception back in 1968, the Rosendale Lions was here to help the community. Therefore, thousands of hours were donated to fixing up our youth park and other things in our community, such as creek clean up and village signs and helping other communities in need with monies and work projects. We also worked on trying to help the community by collecting a number pieces of emergency equipment to loan out to those in need, including wheel chairs, crutches, walkers, beds, etc. We also collected several thousand pairs of eye glasses over the past 25 years.

Many wonder how much the Rosendale Lions spent right here in our community. We spent approximately \$150,000 in projects over the past 25 years. Approximately \$100,000 of this went locally. Also, in some cases we helped other groups raise thousands more with time and sponsorships. Money was raised from such projects as the Peony Days, Chicken Barbecue, Food Stand and Park, Talent Shows, 4th of July Celebrations, selling brooms, light bulbs, and candy, and many other innovative ideas. Many will remember one major fundraiser we had, however, that turned out to be a donation, was our famous fish-o-ree.

There is no question the present and past members of the Rosendale Lions have improved our community and made things better for not only the community but our state, our nation and our world. The leadership has been commendable, and we thank the founders of our club back in 1968 and challenge the future of our club to continue in these efforts. We hope you had fun helping!
