Inspired during a 1952 hospital visitation by the lament, "Blind kids can't go to outdoor camps and stuff like that." He envisioned a solution; a permanent Lions Camp. Lion Ray served as the first Lions Camp Director and eagerly took on its development and in 1959 was recognized as the originator of the Wisconsin Lions Camp by Lions International President, Clarence L. Sturm.
