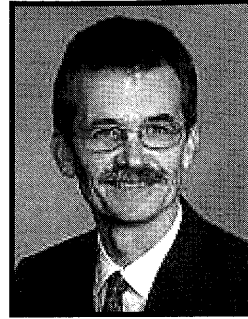
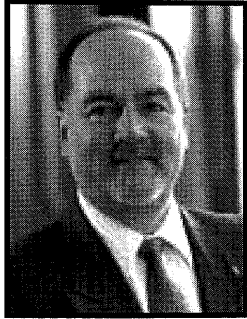
As you can see, the committee has put together an effort to give the convention a new and interesting format. Please be sure to vote!
