We have put together some very interesting seminars for your enjoyment. Please take time to visit the many display tables filled with information to update and educate your clubs on Lionism.

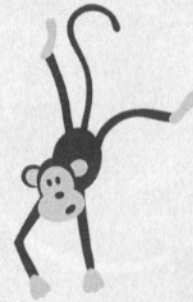

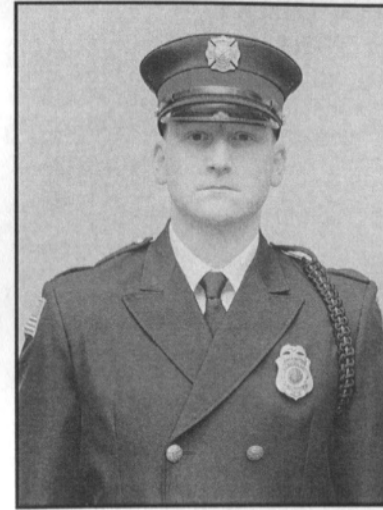


About the Speaker

It started in Mexico when it was called Missions to Mexico but due to the unrest and unsecure environment, the Wisconsin Lions had to look elsewhere to continue their eyeglass missions. So countries like Haiti and Central America

became targeted areas to continue the eyeglass missions. This seminar will show another direction they took South Dakota on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. This travel was less costly and close enough to drive to which made it easier to take part in the mission. The seminar will cover the growing pains of getting started and the dynamics it took Wisconsin Lions to have a successful eyeglass mission. It will take you in the reservation to experience how and what conditions these people live in. POOR is an understatement and you will learn how Wisconsin Lions help better their lives in many ways. There will be a slide presentation on the people, their history, and the eyeglass clinic itself. What is work without a little off. In between schools and set up, there was time to visit the State parks, Mount Rushmore, Custer State Park and Crazy Horse. Though at times Mother Nature controlled the conditions but it still was a great experience to do what Lions do, to better someone's life.

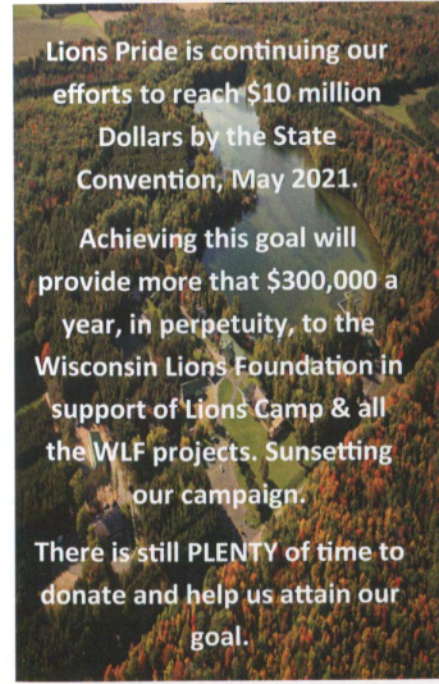
