These include paying the annual dues for girl scout leaders; sponsoring Boy Scout Troop #819; contributing annually to the Community Chest Fund; financing the Junior Safety Patrol and various little league players to Brewer ball games; supporting the high school annual; providing warm-up jackets, caps, tournament fees, etc. for junior ball players; and purchasing a canoe for the explorer scouts.

Major fund raising projects include our annual light bulb sale; trout boil; fly-in; raffles; a stand at the Calumet County Fair; and developing our own club pin.

Inner club activities include the annual golf outing; annual steak fry-out; family picnic; and state and district bowling tournaments.

The following are programs and projects on the state, national, and international level we have supported: the Wisconsin Lions Foundation; Leader Dog; Lions International; Cerebral Palsy; state and district conventions; foreign exchange student; Holiday House; Cancer Crusade; Hotline; Eye Bank; Nicaragua Relief; Kidney Fund; Charter Nights; Green Bay Poison Center; L.I.F.; CARE; and collection of used eye glasses.

Ten Proud Years as a Member Club of
Lions International

"We dedicate this history of ten years to our deceased Lion members: Lion George "Chud" Taylor (Charter Member) and Lion Henry Mathes."

We received our charter on July 18, 1970. The Winnebago East Shore Lions were our sponsors. There were 37 charter members, 20 of which are still with the club. One charter member is deceased.

The New Holstein Lions Club has put forth its best effort to further the high ideals of Lionism in our community, state, nation, and the world. We have had our growing pains, but we hope that we have lived up to our club's motto, "We Serve". We have tried to conduct our affairs in rhythm with our club's slogan, "Liberty - Intelligence - Our Nation's Safety".

We pride ourselves on an 85% attendance record over the past 10 years. Fifteen of our charter members have a perfect attendance record. Two of our members have earned the "Advancement Key Award" and thirteen members have earned the "Key Award".

On the local level, our first major project was to purchase (in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce) a "Welcome to New Holstein" sign, on which current community events are displayed. Other major accomplishments include donating a water slide to the city swimming pool; erecting a flagpole and flower planter at the athletic field; donating an emergency first aid sled and trailer to the county; and donating a cardio-pulmonary resuscitation unit to the Red Cross. For the pleasure of the children, we hold our annual "Breakfast with Santa". We also sponsor a chaperone for the Junior Safety Patrol's annual trip to Washington, D.C.

Physical support has been provided for the following city projects: the Library Fund Drive; Spring Spruce Up Week; distributing home eye testing charts for children; assisting the Historical Society; building a bridge over the Jordan River; painting fire hydrants for the Bicentennial; canvassing the city for the Community Fund; transporting senior citizens to a central viewing area for every major city parade for the past eight years; assisting the local recycling club; and helping the police department with bicycle registrations.

We have given financial support for the following: Kinder Korner; Junior Women's Club; 4-H; New Hope Center; Big Brothers; a foreign exchange student; and sponsoring students to the World Affairs Seminar.

Charity fund raising projects have included our annual Bike-A-Thon for the Retarded and Las Vegas Night for the Cerebral Palsy Fund Drive.

Other projects have included sending Christmas and birthday cards to shut-ins; providing State Lion Magazines in a number of local locations; and giving scholarships to Miss Calumet and graduating high school seniors. We also provide door prizes for the Senior Citizens Center on a monthly basis. Films are provided for the Calumet Homestead and several parties are held each year for the residents. Some local students have been provided with eye glasses.

We have also co-ordinated efforts with other local service organizations
