The Wild Rose Lions have completed their 505c3 process and are currently gathering building estimates and engaging in grant writing. They collaborated with Wild Rose Elementary School for the Boots and Snowpants event, providing eighteen sets.

All five clubs are actively planning their Easter events with the average number of kids attending 60 to 80. As Zone Chair I have met with two separate clubs to help get their online presence up and running.

Now, a few highlights from yesterday's WLF Board meeting:

- 1. Lion Brad Behrens has been named the new Executive Director of the Wisconsin Lions Foundation. Lion Bob is the Immediate Past President of the Foundation and has served on several committees for the Board. He is a Past District Governor of District 27-C1, and a member of the Maine Lions Club.
