## The Auxiliary: First 47 Years

Many other projects continued: helped furnish a club for the blind, an artificial eye for a needy person, eyeglasses to needy students, Christmas gifts and food baskets for the needy, gifts to needy children at the Winnebago Hospital and assistance with eye examinations.

This past year we helped at the food tent for Farm Progress Days, reading tapes for blind students at Lawrence University and helping the Hmong children through Project Bridges.

For many years the women furnished food "pot luck style" for annual Christmas parties and picnics. Today we entertain the men with a Valentine Party.

Our motto has been "To Serve" and stand beside our Lions Club men. We congratulate our Lions on their 60th Anniversary and look forward to serving with them in the years ahead!

## APPLETON NOON LIONS CLUB

The Appleton Lions Club was organized April 6, 1922, with Dr. J. A. Holmes (a Methodist pastor) as its first president. On May 1, 1922, the Club received its charter from Lions International as a member of the Illinois District, since there was no Wisconsin district at that time. However, in a few weeks, on May 22, 1922, the Wisconsin clubs were organized into District 27 of Lions International.

Dr. Holmes was elected the first Governor of District 27 and therefore he was able to serve only a short time as president of the Appleton Club. (Dr. J. L. Benton was elected to serve the unexpired term.) Later, in 1944, an Appleton Lion, Robert M. Connolly, also served as District Governor. It is fitting that on the 50th Anniversary of the Appleton Lions Club and District 27, another Appleton Lion, Everett M. Lee was the Governor of District 27B-1, a subdivision of the original District 27.

From the beginning, the members of the Appleton Lions Club have taken their obligations as Lions seriously and over the past 60 years have initiated and carried out many projects for the benefit of the community and state.

The first major project was undertaken in 1923 when the club was only a year old. That was to raise \$1,100 to purchase equipment to start a band at Appleton High School. Funds were raised by sponsoring concerts by the Rhonda Chorus of Welsh Singers, the Green Bay High School Band and the Swiss Bell Ringers. Since that time the Club has maintained a continuous interest in the high school band and other musical groups. In 1930 and again in 1940, uniforms were purchased for the band. At other times, equipment for junior high school and Boy Scout drum and bugle corps were purchased, as well as robes for the high school choir.

The Club also has been involved in helping other young people of the community. In 1927, a campaign was sponsored to raise \$4,000 to revive the Boy Scout movement and place it on the way to the fine set-up it is today. Other youth activities which the Club has assisted in various ways are: school safety patrols, Badger Boys State, banquets for high school athletes, the Americanos Drum Corps, the annual City Halloween party, the Foreign Youth Exchange program and many others. Over the last 10 years around \$4,000 has been used to sponsor students visiting Norway, France, Japan, England, Switzerland and Sweden. Students from Finland, France, Japan, Sweden and Switzerland have visited Appleton.

The work for the blind is an important Lions project and the Appleton Lions Club has provided assistance continually over the years for the visually handicapped. Over \$6,000 has been contributed to the Wisconsin Lions Camp near Rosholt, and, in the past ten years alone, over \$10,600 has been donated for eye examinations, eyeglasses and other visual aids for worthy needy recipients in the community. Over \$9,100 was donated to the Wisconsin Lions Foundation for its work with the state Eyebank and other projects. The club sponsored a free Glaucoma Diagnosis Clinic in 1975.

Other donations made by the Club for the welfare of the community are: \$1,500 each to Appleton Memorial and St. Elizabeth Hospitals; \$1,000 to the YMCA building fund and \$500 to the Plamann School for retarded children.

An interesting project in 1931 was the purchase and erection of an historical marker commemorating the signing of the "Treaty of the Cedars" in 1836 with the Menominee Indians in which four million acres of land north of the Fox River were ceded by the Indians to the United States. Over 4,000 people, including many state and local dignitaries and Indian chiefs, attended the unveiling ceremony. The marker is located on the south side of Highway 96 between Appleton and Little Chute.

Another important project was the donation of \$2,600 to the City of Appleton in 1969 to purchase equipment for a new park to be called Lions Park. This park is located in the southeast part of Appleton. The Appleton Evening Lions Club also

donated a substantial sum to this project. An additional \$3,800 was given for play equipment in 1976.

Funds for all of these activities have been raised in various ways; sponsoring a variety of concerts and other programs, sale of brooms, sale of fruit cakes, etc. In recent years, the major fund-raising project has been the annual light bulb sale.

The Appleton Lions Club also has been greatly interested in promotion of Lionism. In 1936, the Club sponsored the organization of new Lions clubs in Neenah, Menasha, and Kaukauna. All of these clubs are very active at the present time. In 1963, the Club also sponsored the organization of the Appleton Evening Lions Club which has become a group of enthusiastic and dedicated Lions. Our Club now unofficially is known as the Appleton Noon Lions Club although we are incorporated as the Appleton Lions Club.

The Club was host to the State Lions Convention in 1928 and also to the State Lions bowling tournaments in 1946 and 1970. In 1972, the Club, in cooperation with the Appleton Evening Lions Club sponsored the Wisconsin State Lions Convention, almost exactly on the 50th anniversary of the organization of District 27 in Wisconsin. Over these 50 years, the number of clubs in Wisconsin increased so rapidly that the original district has been subdivided several times and now consists of ten sub-districts. Appleton is in 27-B1. Wisconsin is now known as Multiple District 27.

Among our most recent projects is the equipping of an Emergency Eye Treatment Room at St. Elizabeth. Over \$4,000 has been donated for this room and equipment.

There are many other activities of the Appleton Lions that could be mentioned, all of them in line with the Lions motto, "We Serve." As symbolized by the Lions emblem, with a Lion facing forward and back, the Appleton Lions are proud of the past and looking forward with confidence to the future.

## 1922-1987 A BRIEF HISTORY

The Appleton Lions Club was organized April 6, 1922, with Dr. J. A. Holmes (a Methodist pastor) as its first president. On May 1, 1922, the club received its charter from Lions International as a member of the Illinois District, since there was no Wisconsin district then. On May 22 a Wisconsin district was established.

Dr. Holmes was elected the first Governor of District 27 and so was able to serve as president only a short time (Dr J. L. Benton served the unexpired term). In 1944, Robert M. Connolly served as District Governor, followed by Everett M. Lee in 1971 and Eugene H. Norberg in 1984.

WE SERVE is the Lions' motto and it was taken seriously by the Club. \$1,100 was raised in 1923 by sponsoring concerts by the Rhonda Chorus of Welsh Singers, the Green Bay High School Band, and the Swiss Bell Ringers to purchase equipment to start a band at Appleton High School. In 1930 and again in 1940, uniforms were purchased for the band. At other times equipment for junior high school bands and the Boy Scout drum and bugle corps was purchased, as well as robes for the high school choir.

The Club has long been involved with helping the youth of the community. In 1927, a campaign was sponsored to raise \$4,000 to revive the Boy Scout movement and get it on track to the fine organization it is today. Annually, the Club has sponsored a recognition event, first a picnic and then a roller skating party for the Safety Patrol members. For over 40 years a Fall Sports Banquet for Appleton High School has recognized athletes. The Americanos Drum Corps has received support and a student from West has been sponsored each year to Badger Boys State. The Club also helps with an annual Halowe'en Party with the city Recreation Department. Lion Youth Exchange was used to sponsor students from Appleton to Norway, France, Japan, England, Switzerland and Sweden and to bring foreign students to Club host families.

The primary drive of Lions is to aid the visually handicapped. Over \$10,000 has been donated to Lions Camp where those with visual and
