Was blind, but now I see.

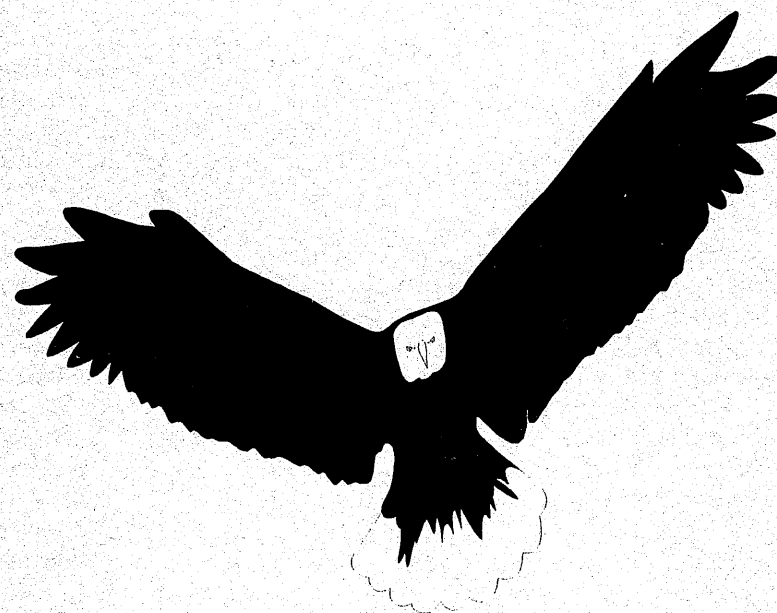
